Faith Milestones at Cross Lutheran

Milestone Ministry is a youth-centered program, although we are working towards making this program intergenerational and open for anyone. This program is designed to commemorate and encourage the development of our youth's Christian faith. Each year of their life; from birth to 18, we will support their faith with age-appropriate material.

The purpose of Faith Markers is to celebrate, nurture and grow the faith of our youth. We will inspire, trust, love and responsibly connect the generations. We will achieve this by:

- Proclaiming God's word
- Offering faith-sharing opportunities and exciting family experiences
- Celebrate our youth as a church family as the children grow

*An invitation will be sent home with your child prior to the event. There will also be an email invitation.

During Baptism, children begin their relationship with our Lord. They receive a blanket made by our Women's Group and are welcomed into our church family.

Some of the Faith Markers/Milestones include:

- 4 y/o: Prayer Buddy (stuffed animal)
- Receiving prayer pillows in kindergarten
- Bibles given out to all 4-year-olds and sixth grade students
- Hosting the "Money Matters" class presented by Thrivent Financial where children (and adults!) learn what it means to spend, save and share
- Offering First Communion instruction to any child (or adult!) in the spring
- We offer Pre-Confirmation classes for youth in grades 4-8, but this is also open to adults
- Confirmation with a focus on the Catechism and the sacraments for youth in 9th grade or adults
- Baccalaureate Sunday for our high school seniors

- Learning about and memorizing the 10 Commandments, the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer
- Learning about what it means to have a friendship with God, what it means to be Lutheran and about how Faith is Like a Seed

As leaders of the Children, Youth and Family Program at Cross, we feel that it is important to prepare the children for the coming years in confirmation. Learning and memorizing the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' Creed and the Ten Commandments, gives the children a solid foundation for the additional information that will be taught in their sixth, seventh and eighth grade years at confirmation.
